

Eglwys Sant Grwst, Llanrwst


St. Grwst's Church, Llanrwst

Mae Capel swynol Gwydir nesaf at eglwys Sant Grwst yn dal arch garreg Llywelyn Fawr sydd wedi'i cherfio'n ofalus. Cafodd Llywelyn ei gladdu yn Abaty Aberconwy, Conwy ym 1240 ond pan orfododd Edward I y mynachod i symud i Abaty Maenan ym 1283, aethant â'r arch gyda nhw. Pan gafodd Maenan ei chwalu gan Harri VIII, aethwyd â'r arch i Sant Grwst ond nid yw gweddillion Llywelyn wedi goroesi. Wrth ochr yr arch, saif delw carreg o Hywel Coetmor, disgynydd tywysogion Gwynedd, cyn-filwr Agincourt ac yn nes ymlaen un o brif gadfridogion Owain Glyndŵr.

The charming Gwydir Chapel adjoining St Grwst's church holds the elaborately carved stone coffin of Llywelyn the Great. Llywelyn was buried at Aberconwy Abbey, Conwy in 1240 but when Edward I forced the monks to relocate to Maenan Abbey in 1283, they took the coffin with them. When Maenan was broken up by Henry VIII, the coffin was bought to St Grwst's but Llywelyn's remains have not survived. Beside the coffin lies a stone effigy of Hywel Coetmor, descendant of the princes of Gwynedd, veteran of Agincourt and later one of Owain Glyndŵr's leading generals.
